

My journey to becoming a seminarian with the Companions of the Cross community began when I was very young. For starters, I have felt a call to the priesthood for almost as long as I can remember. At the age of six or seven I was setting up my stuffed animals as a 'congregation' and pretending to say 'Mass', with my younger siblings acting as altar servers. However, I was first introduced to the Companions of the Cross at the age of nine when Fr. Tim Devine, one of their priests, ran a parish mission in my hometown of Woodstock. I was very much impressed by his talks on the love of God, and the fact that he was able to say Mass and lead worship despite being completely blind. After the mission, I eagerly ran up to him and introduced myself, rambling on and on about how I wanted to be a priest when I grew up. He encouraged me and said, "You will become a priest one day." He then told me a little about the Companions, and my interest in the community was kindled.

I didn't know all of this back then, all I knew was that Fr. Tim impressed me, and I wanted to be a priest like him.
